
Get Started

The following topics give you all the information you need to set up your phone the first time.

Your Phone at a Glance

The following illustration outlines your phone's primary external features and keys.





• **LED indicator** displays a phone notification, charging status, or alert.

LED Indicator	Battery status
RED	Charging
GREEN	Fully charged

- **Proximity/Light sensor** detects how close an object is to the surface of the screen. This is typically used to detect when your face is pressed up against the screen, such as during a phone call. The amount of light in the surrounding environment is also detected by this sensor and it is used, for example, to adjust the screen brightness.
- **Touchscreen** displays all the information needed to operate your phone. Use finger gestures to navigate and interact with items on the screen. In Underwater mode, the touch operation will be disabled.
- Front camera takes pictures and records videos while facing the screen and allows you to video conference.
- Receiver/Speaker lets you hear the caller's voice, automated prompts, ringtones, and sounds.
- **USB/Charger port** allows you to connect the phone and a USB Type-C cable for use with the charger adapter or other compatible accessories.

CAUTION! Inserting a non-compliant accessory or cable into the USB Type-C connector may damage the phone.

 Main microphone transmits your voice for phone calls and is used for voice-activated functions.

NOTE: Do not cover the microphone area when using it for functions such as phone calls

- Barometric pressure vent hole allows a flow of air to equalize internal and external barometric pressure and helps the phone's barometer to sense atmospheric pressure accurately.
- Tether point allows you to attach useful accessories.
- SIM/microSD card slot allows you to insert a SIM card and a microSD card placed on the SIM/microSD card tray.

NOTE: microSD cards are sold separately. Your phone supports a microSD card up to 1 TB.

- **Volume keys** allow you to adjust the ringtone or media volume when you are not on a call, or adjust the voice volume during a call.
- **Power key** lets you turn the phone on/off or turn the screen on/off, restart the phone, capture screenshots, or set Lockdown mode.
- **PTT/Programmable key** can be assigned to frequently used applications or functions for quick access. See **Programmable Key**. PTT related features may be available through different applications, contact your service provider about feature availability and functionality.
- Secondary microphone suppresses background noise improving audio quality for the other party during voice calls.

NOTE: Do not cover the microphone area when using it for functions such as phone calls.

- Fingerprint sensor lets you unlock the phone with your fingerprint. See Fingerprint.
- Qi wireless charging location indicates how to position the phone when using a Qi wireless charger (sold separately). See Charge the battery wirelessly.
- Flash helps illuminate subjects in low-light environments when taking a picture or recording a video. It can also work as an LED flashlight. See Flashlight.
- Wide-angle camera lets you take pictures and videos in wide-angle mode.
- Main camera lets you take pictures and videos as phone's main camera.

Set Up Your Phone

You need to charge the battery to begin setting up your phone.

Charge the battery

Fully charge the battery before powering on the phone.


NOTE: The battery cannot be removed from the phone. For replacing or disposing of the battery, contact a KYOCERA authorized service center.

IMPORTANT: Unplug the AC adapter from the electrical outlet when not in use to reduce the environmental impact of charging.

IMPORTANT: Use only a USB Type-C charger/cable for this phone.

- 1. Insert the smaller end of the USB cable into the phone's USB/Charger port.
- 2. Insert the other end of the cable into the AC adapter, and then plug the adapter into an electrical outlet.

TIP: For the fastest charging times, use the optional Adaptive Fast Charging AC adapter SCP-53ADT* (sold separately). and its dedicated cable SCP-27SDC* (sold separately). *Part number: 5AAXAD080ULA- (adapter), 5AACCN000111A (cable). For more information, visit solutions.kyoceramobile.com/shop.



WARNING: Use only approved chargers and cables with your phone. Improper handling of the charging port, as well as the use of an incompatible charger or cable, may cause damage to your device and void the warranty.

3. When charging is complete, remove the cable from the port.

Charge the battery wirelessly

Your phone supports Qi and works with Qi-enabled chargers. Follow the steps below to charge the battery using a wireless charger (sold separately).

- 1. Locate the charging location on your wireless charger by referring to the charger documentation.
- 2. Place your phone so that the wireless charging location of your phone is directly centered over, and touches, the charging location of your wireless charger.

Before starting wireless charging, please note the following:

- If the charging locations are not touching, the charging results will be poor.
- Make sure there is nothing between your phone and wireless charger, especially anything metal.

- Your phone may become hot while charging the battery. This is normal.
- If charging doesn't start after positioning your phone correctly, please try a different wireless charger or use the AC adapter provided with your phone and a Kyoceraapproved USB data cable.



Install microSD card and reinstall SIM card

Inserting a compatible microSD card into your phone will increase its storage capacity. Your phone may come with a preinstalled SIM card. If you need to install or reinstall the SIM card, follow the instructions below.

NOTE: microSD cards are sold separately.

1. With the phone facing up, insert your fingernail into the slit on the SIM/microSD card tray cover and pull out the tray.





2. Put the tray onto a flat surface and place a microSD card into the tray. Ensure the gold contacts are facing down as shown.



NOTE: If you need to install or reinstall your SIM card, remove the original SIM card from the tray and place your new SIM card into the tray with the gold contacts facing down as shown.

3. Insert the tray into the phone, being careful not to let the cards slide out. Then gently push the tray back into the slot until it fits into place.



4. In order to maintain your phone's waterproof seal, confirm that the card tray cover is securely closed.



WARNING: Do not use the phone under water if the SIM/microSD card tray cover is broken or open.

NOTE: You can easily damage the microSD card by improper operation. Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling the microSD card.

NOTE: Make sure your battery is fully charged before using the microSD card. Your data may become damaged or unusable if the battery runs out while using the microSD card.

Turn Your Phone On and Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

To turn your phone On:

▶ Press and hold the **Power key** until the screen lights up.

To turn your phone Off:

- 1. Press and hold the **Power key** until the Power menu screen is displayed.
- 2. Tap Power off to turn the phone off.

To restart your phone:

- 1. Press and hold the **Power key** until the Power menu screen is displayed.
- 2. Tap **Restart** to restart the phone.

To put your phone into Lockdown mode:

NOTE: When Lockdown mode is enabled, only Pattern, PIN, and Password can be used to unlock the phone and other unlock methods, such as Fingerprint, Face Unlock, and Smart Lock, are completely disabled. This option will only be shown when a screen lock method besides None or Swipe has been selected. For more information about Screen lock, see Screen lock.

- 1. Press and hold the **Power key** until the Power menu screen is displayed.
- 2. Tap **Lockdown** to enable Lockdown mode.

Setup Wizard

When you turn on your phone for the first time, the Setup Wizard starts automatically. Follow the onscreen instructions to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi network, choose the device protection, set up accounts, and more.

Turn your screen on and off

Your phone allows you to quickly turn the screen off when not in use and to turn it back on when you need it.

Turn the screen off when not in use

➤ To turn the screen off, quickly press the **Power key**. Pressing the **Power key** again or receiving an incoming call will turn on your phone screen.

To save battery power, the phone screen automatically turns off after a certain period of time when left idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone screen is off.

NOTE: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see Screen timeout.

Turn the screen on and start with swipe

1. Press the **Power key** to turn the screen on.

NOTE: To set up a screen lock for security, see Screen lock.

2. Touch and hold . The below screen appears by default.



- 3. On the screen, swipe toward:
 - to access the Home screen or the screen displayed before it was turned off.
 - to launch the Camera app.
 - Use to launch Google Assistant™.


Phone Basics

Your phone is packed with features that simplify your life and expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. The following topics will introduce the basic functions and features of your phone.


Touchscreen Navigation

Your phone's touchscreen lets you control actions through a variety of tap gestures.

Tap: Tap the screen with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application. A light tap works best.




Touch and Hold: To open the available options for an item (for example, a keyboard), touch and hold the item.



Drag: Touch and hold the item on the screen before you start to move it. Do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.




Swipe or Slide: To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.



Flick: Flicking the screen is similar to swiping, except that you need to swipe your finger in light, quick strokes.



Pinch and Spread: Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger to zoom out, or spread the screen to zoom in when viewing a picture or a Web page. (Move fingers inward to zoom out and outward to zoom in.)



Function Buttons

You will find a row of three buttons that let you perform specific functions as below.



- Back : Tap to return to the previous screen or close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications panel, or onscreen keyboard.
- Home : Tap to open the Home screen.

Touch and hold to launch Google Assistant.


• Recent : Tap to open a list of thumbnail images of screens you have worked with recently. To open one, tap it. To remove a screen from the list, swipe it up. To capture a screenshot of a listed screen, tap Screenshot displayed below the screen image. (Only available in portrait mode.) To close all screens, swipe left to right to the end of the recent list and tap CLEAR ALL.

Your Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your Home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, wallpapers, and more.

Home screen overview

The following illustration describes the basics of the Home screen.



- **Status Bar:** Displays the time, notification icons, and phone status icons. Slide down to display the Notifications panel. See **Status bar**.
- Widget: Allows users to access various useful programs.
- Google Search Widget: Allows you to enter text or spoken keywords for a quick search on the phone or on the Internet. Tap the input field to enter text, tap ↓ to speak your keyword, or tap to search with images by using the Google Lens™ app.
- **Folder:** Allows you to organize screen items. You can store multiple application icons as a group. See Use folders.

- Favorites Tray: Contains up to five icons and appears on every Home screen.
- Shortcut: Allows you to quickly launch applications.

Manage the Home screens

Learn how to customize the Home screens.

Add widgets

To get useful information more easily, you can add widgets to your Home screens.

- 1. Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- 3. Swipe the screen and tap \bigvee to find the item you want to add to the Home screen.
- 4. Touch and hold the item and move your finger.

TIP: If you want to add it to a different Home screen from the one where you are, keep moving your finger to either the left or right edge of the screen and it will scroll to the next Home screen. By holding the item against the right edge of the rightmost Home screen, you can create an additional Home screen.

5. When you find the position to place it, release your finger.

Add shortcut icons

Place shortcuts for your favorite apps on the Home screen.

- 1. Swipe up on the Home screen, tap to hide the keyboard if necessary, and then touch and hold the shortcut icon you want to add to the Home screen.
- 2. Move your finger.
- 3. When you find the position to place it, release your finger.

Move or remove items

You can change and move the Home screen items.

- ► Touch and hold the item on the Home screen that you want to move or remove.
 - To move the item, drag it to a new area and release it.
 - To remove the item, drag it to "Remove" at the top of the screen and release it.

TIP: If you remove all widgets and shortcut icons from any Home screen which is not the main Home screen, that Home screen will be deleted. Please note that shortcut icons in the favorites tray are not affected.

Favorites tray

The favorites tray displays up to five icons and appears on every Home screen. You can replace them with another icon you want to place there.

To add a new icon to the favorites tray:

- 1. Remove one of the icons from the favorites tray.
- 2. Touch and hold the icon of the app you wish to add, and drag it to the favorites tray.
- 3. Release your finger.

Use folders

Create and manage folders as necessary.

- 1. Touch and hold an app icon and drag it over another app icon.
- 2. Release your finger. Both icons are in a newly created folder.

TIP: To add app icons to a folder, touch and hold the app icon, drag it over a folder.

3. Tap the folder > **Edit Name**. The keyboard opens, and you can name the folder. To rename it, tap the name.

Home settings menu

Use these menus to configure your Home screen.

- 1. Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen.
- 2. Tap Home settings.
- 3. The following options are available:
 - Notification dots to change the Notification access setting, such as whether or not to show the notification dots.
 - Add app icons to home screen to have the phone automatically add a shortcut icon to the Home screen when apps are installed.
 - **Swipe to access Google app** to display Google News Feed by swiping right from the main Home screen.
 - Allow home screen rotation to enable auto rotate for your home screen.

Wallpaper & style

You can personalize your phone by changing the color tone of onscreen elements and assigning your favorite background wallpaper.

► Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen and then tap **Wallpaper & style** to open the Wallpaper & style screen.

To change the wallpaper:

- 1. From the Wallpaper & style screen, tap Change wallpaper.
- 2. To use your own image, tap My photos.

- or -

Tap **Abstract**, **Macro**, or **Landscape** to use a preloaded image.

- 3. Select an image. The preview screen is displayed.
 - You can alternate the displayed preview by tapping Home screen and Lock screen.
- Tap ✓.
- 5. Select Home screen, Lock screen or Home and lock screens.

NOTE: Available options vary depending on the current settings.

To customize your phone's style:

- 1. From the Wallpaper & style screen, tap Wallpaper colors or Basic colors.
 - Wallpaper colors to choose your theme color from the pallets which the phone generates automatically based on your wallpaper choice.
 - Basic colors to choose your theme color from the basic colors that will be available no matter which wallpaper you apply.
- 2. Select an option you want to use.

To turn Dark theme on or off:

► From the Wallpaper & style screen, tap the **Dark theme** on/off icon to turn on or off. For more information, see **Dark theme**.

To enable Themed icons:

► From the Wallpaper & style screen, tap the **Themed icons** on/off icon to enable the function.

Apps launcher

You can find and access numerous apps installed on your phone or available on the app store.

- 1. Swipe up from the bottom of the Home screen to open the Apps launcher screen.
- 2. Tap an app icon you want to open.

TIP: You can change the order of the apps displayed in the Apps launcher by tapping

Sort. Select Alphabetical or Frequently used, or tap Custom > Change

order to change the icon position as you like.

Permission

When you launch an app or service for the first time or after an extended period of disuse, you might be asked if you can permit its access to certain features of your device. For each request, you can choose from the available options, including **ALLOW**, **WHILE USING THE APP**, **ONLY THIS TIME**, or **DON'T ALLOW**. If you want to manage the whole permission settings, go to the settings menu as mentioned below.

To check the permission status:

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Privacy** > **Permission manager**.
- 2. Select a feature you want to check.
- 3. You can see a list of permission types and which apps have permission to access each feature.
- 4. If you want to change the permission setting of an app, tap the app and select a permission type you want to change. You can choose from options such as: Allow, Allow all the time, Allow only while using the app, Ask every time, and Don't allow.

NOTE: Available options vary depending on the feature.

Quick shortcuts

By touching and holding an application icon, quick shortcuts will be displayed on the Home screen.



- 1. Touch and hold an application icon to display the quick shortcuts available for that app.
- 2. Tap a shortcut to the menu that you want to go directly to.

TIP: To create a quick shortcut icon and place it on the Home screen, touch and hold instead, and put it where you want.

Status bar

The status bar at the top of the screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left. The following tables show some examples:



Notifications panel

You can open the Notifications panel to view the list of notifications you received, Wi-Fi connection status, and more.



To open the Notifications panel:

- ▶ Slide the status bar down toward the bottom of the touchscreen.
 - To clear a single notification, swipe it away to the left or right.

- To clear all deletable notifications, tap CLEAR ALL.
- To select a notification method, touch and hold a notification. Select from the options displayed.
- To open the main Settings app for App notifications, tap Manage. For details, see Notifications.

To close the Notifications panel:

Swipe up from the bottom of the screen.

- or -

Tap ◀.

Quick settings

The quick settings panels enable you to quickly access useful menu items.

- 1. Slide the status bar down toward the bottom of the touchscreen. To show more tiles (items), slide the Quick Settings panel downward.
 - To adjust the screen brightness, drag the knob on the brightness slider left or right.
- 2. Tap on a quick setting tile to enable or disable the feature.
 - Touch and hold a tile to access its settings menu.
 - To see the other panel, swipe the panel to the left.
 - To change the position of the tiles or add other tiles to the panels, tap to open the Edit screen. Touch and hold the tile you want to move or add, and then drag it to a different location and release your finger. The tiles in the area above the message "Hold and drag to add tiles" will be displayed on the quick settings panels.


Enter Text

You can type on your phone using one of the available touchscreen keyboards or using your voice. The keyboard appears automatically onscreen when you tap a text entry field and can be used in either portrait or landscape mode.

Gboard

Gboard offers a traditional QWERTY keyboard setup for entering text by tapping keys (like on a computer), along with enhancements and options that allow you to enter text faster and more accurately, such as continuous key input, personalized usage dictionaries, and more.

Gboard overview

Text mode

ABC mode is primarily used for entering letters while Number & Symbol mode is for numbers and symbols.

- ► Tap (ABC) to select ABC mode. Tap (?123) to select Number & Symbol mode.
 - In ABC mode, tap 🗘 to alter the capitalization:

 - ♠ (One-character-shifted) to capitalize only the first letter of a word.
 - You can select the caps lock by double-tapping ☆ or ★ to make all letters in uppercase.
 - ♠ (Caps lock) to enter all letters in uppercase.
 - In Number & Symbol mode, tap = to display more symbols.
 - Some keys have alternate characters. In either mode, if a key displays an extra character at the upper right corner, touch and hold the key to enter the character.
 Or, touch and long hold a key to call up a list of all the characters available on that key, and slide your finger to the character you want to enter on the list.

Add a word to the user dictionary



Copy and paste text

In applications that require text entry, such as Gmail, use the copy and paste functions to copy and paste text from one application to the same application or another.

- Touch and hold the text body you want to copy. Selection tabs appear, and the selected words or characters are highlighted. Drag the tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text if necessary.



Enhanced 911 (E911) Information

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E911 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 911 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take up to 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

IMPORTANT: Always report your location to the 911 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot."

The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depend on several factors, including infrastructure and objects through which the signal passes.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Network & internet** > **Internet** to open the Internet screen.

Turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

Use the Network & internet settings menu to enable your phone's Wi-Fi radio and connect to an available Internet network.

- 1. From the Internet screen, tap the on/off icon next to Wi-Fi to turn it on.
- 2. Tap the available network to connect.
 - If you selected an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network.
 - If you selected a network that is secured with a password, enter the password, and then tap CONNECT.

NOTE: If the wireless network you want to connect to is not in the list of detected networks, tap **Add network** at the bottom of the list. Enter the wireless network settings and tap **SAVE**.

If you selected the network that the phone is currently connected to, you will see Network details showing the Wi-Fi network name, status, signal strength, frequency, and more.

Depending on the network type and its security settings, you may also need to enter more information or choose a security certificate.

When your phone is connected to a wireless network, the Wi-Fi icon appears in the status bar and tells you the approximate signal strength. (The above icon indicates maximum signal strength.)

NOTE: The next time your phone connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not be prompted to enter the password again, unless you reset your phone to its factory default settings or you instruct the phone to forget the network.

NOTE: Wi-Fi networks are self-discoverable, which means no additional steps are required for your phone to connect to a Wi-Fi network. However, it may be necessary to provide a user name and password for certain closed wireless networks.

Wi-Fi settings menu

The Wi-Fi settings menu lets you turn Wi-Fi on or off, set up and connect to available Wi-Fi networks, and configure advanced Wi-Fi options.

- ► From the Internet screen, scroll down to see these items.
 - Add network to add networks to the network list. Tap to add a Wi-Fi network by scanning a QR code.

TIP: If you want to connect to a hidden network, change the **Hidden network** to **Yes** in **Advanced options**.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth on or off

Use the settings menu to enable or disable your phone's Bluetooth capabilities.

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Connected devices** > **Connection preferences** > **Bluetooth** to open the Bluetooth settings screen.
- 2. Tap the on/off icon next to **Use Bluetooth** to turn it on or off.

NOTE: Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless phone is prohibited, such as aboard an aircraft and in hospitals.

Change the device name

The device name identifies your phone to other devices.

NOTE: The display may vary depending on the connected device.

Send and receive information

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information such as images or videos between your phone and another Bluetooth-enabled device such as a phone or notebook computer.

To send information from your phone to another device:

- 1. Pair with the receiving device.
- 2. On the phone, open the application that contains the information or file you want to send
- 3. Tap the item you want to send and tap or Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. Tap the name of the receiving device.
- 5. On the receiving device, accept the download.

To receive information from another device:

- 1. Pair with the sending device.
- 2. On the sending device, send one or more files to your phone.
- 3. When your phone receives a file transfer request notification, slide down the Notifications panel, tap the notification, and then tap **ACCEPT**.
- 4. When a file is transferred, a notification will be displayed. To open the file, slide down the Notifications panel, and then tap the relevant notification.

Near Field Communication (NFC) Technology

NFC (Near Field Communication) technology is a short-range, wireless technology that lets you quickly and wirelessly exchange information between your phone and other NFC-enabled devices. You can use this function to purchase goods or take a train in a contactless manner by installing your preferred payment/transit apps in your phone and bringing your phone close to the target NFC terminal.



Turn NFC on or off

Use the settings menu to enable or disable your phone's NFC capabilities.

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap Connection preferences > NFC.

- 3. The following options are available:

Mobile Hotspot & Tethering

Mobile Hotspot allows you to turn your phone into a Wi-Fi hotspot, while Tethering functionality lets you share your phone's Internet connection with other devices. These features work best when used in conjunction with 4G LTE or 5G data services.

► From the Apps launcher, tap Settings > Network & internet > Mobile Hotspot & tethering to open the Mobile Hotspot & tethering screen.

Turn Mobile Hotspot on or off







- Tap to switch to Night mode. This icon will appear automatically when the device detects low light. Only available in Photo mode.

Video



- Records a video.
- Stops recording a video.
- Recording Time Counter: Displays the elapsed time while recording a video.

Take a picture or record a video

You can take high quality photos and videos with your phone's camera.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap
- 2. Select Photo or Video on the camera menu bar.
- 3. Do the following to change the settings:
 - Tap to change the camera and video settings as desired. See Camera settings.
 - Tap to switch between the front camera and the main camera.

- Tap w / w or T / T to switch between the main camera and the wide-angle camera. See Wide-angle camera.
- Adjust your zoom level.
- Adjust your brightness level if necessary.
- Tap any point on the viewfinder to focus on that area.
- 4. Frame your subject on the screen.
- 5. Tap to take a picture.

– or –

Tap • to start recording. To stop recording, tap •.

6. Tap the thumbnail icon to view the image you've just taken or recorded.

Action Overlay mode

You can take a photo or record a video with additional information such as elapsed time, travel distance, speed, G-force, altitude, map, or weather.

WARNING: Do not operate the app while driving or riding a bicycle or motorcycle. If necessary, stop moving first and operate the app with careful attention to safety.

- ► From the Home screen, tap > More > Action Overlay.
 - Action Overlay mode uses location information. You will be prompted to enable the Location settings if they are disabled.
 - is active. Tap o or to toggle between the video and camera mode.
 - To close the Action Overlay mode, tap (X).
 - Tap to configure the Action Overlay mode settings.

Underwater mode

You can take a picture or record video in the water. Your phone is immersible in water for up to 30 minutes at a depth not exceeding two meters (about 6.56 ft.).

WARNING: Avoid using the phone in saltwater. It is highly corrosive and can damage internal components and degrade the audio performance over time.

1. From the Home screen, tap > More > Underwater.


- In Underwater mode, the following physical keys are used instead of touchscreen icons.
 The touchscreen is unavailable except thumbnail area.
 - Press the Volume up key to take photos.
 - Press the Volume down key to record videos.
 - Long press the Volume down key to turn the light on or off.
 - Press the PTT/Programmable key to switch between the front, back, and wide-angle camera.
 - Long press the PTT/Programmable key to exit the Underwater mode.

WARNING: Before immersing your phone in the water, make sure the SIM/microSD card tray cover is properly closed, with no foreign objects obstructing the seal, to maintain the waterproof capability. The phone should never be used under water if the card tray cover is broken or open.

NOTE: After using your phone under water, promptly rinse the phone gently in clean, fresh water. The phone should be dried using a very specific procedure. See Drying Your Phone.

Review screen

After taking a picture or video, tap the thumbnail image to see the item in the review screen.



- Displays available menus for the image. Available menus may vary:
 - **Back up now**: Uploads the images to your Google Account. This menu displays only for images not backed up.
 - **Loop video on:** Select this option to see a video repeatedly. This menu displays only when reviewing a video.

- View in: Opens the video by other apps.
- Add to album: Adds the selected picture/video to albums.
- **Delete from device:** Deletes the image from the device.
- Order photo: Submits a print order of your photos to pick them up later at nearby stores.
- Use as: Sets the picture as the contact photo or wallpaper.
- **Slideshow:** Starts the slideshow of the pictures stored in the Photos application.
- **Print:** Prints the selected picture.
- Help & feedback: Opens the Help window with the Feedback action.
- Registers the image as Favorites.
- : Opens the Photos.
- Starts casting your photos or videos to your TV. This icon will appear only when your phone is on the same Wi-Fi network as your Chromecast or TV with Chromecast built-in.
- Returns to the Camera.
- Share: Displays available applications to share your image.
- Edit: Displays the editing options. For details, see Edit a picture.
- Lens: Opens the Google Lens app. You can obtain some interesting information about your photos. For more information, please visit support.google.com/photos.
- Delete: Deletes the currently displayed image. Tap Delete > Move to trash to confirm the deletion.

Camera settings

You can adjust the settings of your camera by tapping on the viewfinder screen. Some options are available for the main camera only.

NOTE: Available options may vary according to the subject and mode.

Photo

• **Photo size:** Select from the preferable size settings shown on the screen.

- Auto HDR: Switch on or off. Set to on to combine images automatically to prevent white spots or blackouts.
- Auto night detection: Switch on or off.
- Continuous shooting: Switch on or off.

Video

- Video size: Select from the preferable size settings shown on the screen.
- **Image stabilization:** Switch on or off. Set to on to reduce camera shake.
- Recording file format: Select from the options shown on the screen.
- Recording type: Select Record monaural sound or Record stereo sound.
- Mute audio: Switch on or off.
- Wind noise reduction: Switch on or off.
- **Disabling notifications:** Switch on or off.

Common

- **Storage:** Select where to store your pictures and videos from **Phone** or **SD card** (only available when a microSD card (optional) is inserted).
- Add location information: Switch on or off. Set to on to store the location information of the image.
- **Preserve last mode:** Switch on or off. Set to on to preserve the mode you are in and launch Camera application next time with the preserved mode.
- Shutter sound: Switch on or off.

Useful features

- Quick social media: Tap the on/off icon next to Use Quick social media to turn it on or off. When set to on, choose up to three apps for sharing.
- Self timer: Select from Off, 2 seconds, 5 seconds, or 10 seconds.
- **Grid:** Switch on or off.

• Wide camera distortion: Switch on or off.

• Underwater distortion: Switch on or off.

Key settings

- **Volume key:** Select from the options shown on the screen.
- Programmable key (long press): Select from the options shown on the screen.

Other

- Edit modes: Check the mode you want to add to or uncheck to remove from the camera menu bar. The removed items will be shown under More. Video, Photo, and More cannot be unchecked.
- **Choose theme:** Select from the options shown on the screen.
- Camera function guide: Displays the help information for camera.
- Reset settings: Restores all the camera settings to original state. Tap RESET to confirm.

View Pictures and Videos Using Photos

Using the Google Photos™ application, you can view pictures and watch videos that you've taken with your phone's camera, downloaded, or copied onto your microSD card or phone's internal storage.

For pictures that are on your microSD card or phone's internal storage, you can do basic editing such as rotating and cropping. You can also easily assign a picture as your contact picture or wallpaper and share pictures with your friends.

View pictures and videos

You can browse through the pictures and videos in grid view. Tap a picture or video to view.

1. From the Home screen, tap 👈.



- 2. Scroll up or down to find a picture or video you want to view.
- 3. Tap an image of a picture or video you want to view.
 - For a video, it automatically starts playing. While playing, tapping the screen will display the control options. Tap up to pause or drag the dot on the timeline to rewind or forward. Tap to resume.
 - For a picture, it displays the one you selected. When viewing, pinch & spread on the screen to zoom in or out on the picture. You can also zoom in and out by tapping quickly twice on the screen.

Work with Pictures

You can easily manage and retouch your pictures.

Edit a picture

Your phone has a built in editing tool and you can edit your pictures easily.

- 1. Tap a picture > Edit.
- 2. Tap Suggestions, Crop, Adjust, Filters, Markup or More and edit your picture as desired.



- Suggestions: Choose one of the suggested options for your picture.
- **Crop:** Crop or rotate the picture by using the available tools.
- Adjust: Apply some effects to adjust the picture.
- **Filters:** Apply color effects to the picture.
- Markup: Make your picture unique by drawing, highlighting, and adding text.
- More: Use Office Suite to edit the picture.
- 3. When finished, tap **Save** or **Save copy**.

Share Pictures and Videos

The Photos application lets you send pictures and videos using email or multimedia messages. You can share pictures on your social networks. You can also send them to another phone or your computer using Bluetooth.

- 1. Touch and hold the picture or video to place a check mark on it. Tap multiple pictures and videos to select them.
- 2. Tap <
- 3. Tap one of the available sharing options, such as Gmail, Bluetooth, and Messages.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to share.

Clock

The Clock application functions as a world clock that shows the date and time. You can also use it to turn your phone into an alarm clock, a countdown timer, or a stopwatch.

Alarm

You can use your phone as an alarm clock.

1. From the Apps launcher, tap Clock > Alarm.

NOTE: When you first open the alarms, two alarms are set up by default and ready for you to customize. These alarms are turned off by default.

2. Tap an existing alarm time to change the settings.

- 3. Set the time and tap **OK**. You will see the on/off icon set to on next to the time you have set.
- 4. Add a label, set repeat option, select an alarm sound, and turn on or off the vibration.

Clock

You can add the time from around the globe on the Clock screen.

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap Clock > Clock.
- 2. Tap + and enter the city name in the search field. As you type, any matching city from the list are displayed. Tap the city you want to display on the Clock screen.
 - Tap : on the top right of the screen to display the option menu.

Timer

You can use your phone as a countdown timer.

1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Clock** > **Timer**.

- 2. Set the countdown time and tap to start the countdown.
- 3. The following options are available:
 - Tap the current label to change the description of the timer.
 - + 1:00 to add an additional minute to the remaining time.
 - to return to the start of the countdown.
 - to delete the timer.
 - to stop the countdown.

 - Tap : on the top right of the screen to display the option menu.

Stopwatch

You can use your phone as a stopwatch.

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap Clock > Stopwatch.
- 2. Tap to start the stopwatch.
- 3. The following options are available:
 - to reset the stopwatch.
 - to stop timing.
 - to resume timing.
 - o to record the lap time.
 - Tap i on the top right of the screen to display the option menu.

Bedtime

Manage a healthy sleep schedule by using some convenient menus.

1. From the Apps launcher, tap Clock > Bedtime > Get started.

- 2. Set a wake-up time and the days to apply it and tap **Next**.
- 3. Set a bedtime and the days to apply it and tap **Done**.
- 4. The following options are available:
 - See recent bedtime activity: Tap Continue to see your estimated time spent in bed
 - Listen to sleep sounds: Tap Choose a sound to choose a sound which can help you to fall asleep.
 - See your upcoming events: Tap Continue to check your events on the next day.
 - Tap : on the top right of the screen to display the option menu.

Calculator

Your phone has a convenient calculator that lets you perform basic mathematical equations.

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Calculator**.
- 2. The following options are available:
 - Tap 🛮 to clear a digit. To clear an entire number, tap 🗚 .

 - Tap i for more options.

Flashlight

Your phone's camera flash can work as a flashlight.

WARNING: Do not shine the flashlight into anyone's eyes, as doing so may compromise their vision and cause an accident.

- 1. Slide the status bar down toward the bottom of the touchscreen and then slide the Quick Settings panel downward.
- 2. Tap to turn the light on.
- 3. Tap 🕇 to turn it off.
- 4. Touch and hold the **Flashlight** tile to open the Flashlight screen.
 - You can set Blink speed and Brightness.

Sound Recorder

The Sound Recorder app lets you record sound and save it as an audio file on your phone or inserted microSD card.

Record sound

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Sound Recorder** to open the Sound Recorder screen.
- 2. Tap > File format to select the format type.
- 3. Tap : > Storage to select where to save the recorded data.
- 4. Tap to start recording.
 - Tap II to pause recording. Tap to resume recording.
- 5. Tap to stop recording.

Play audio data

On the screen where you finished recording, tap ▶.

From the Sound Recorder screen, tap = and then tap a file.

- 2. The following options are available:
 - Drag the bar to rewind or fast-forward the data.
 - Tap to display the list of the stored files.

 - **Weather:** Displays the weather information in 6-hour increments. See Weather.

Weather

Your Weather widget can display a large variety of weather information.

To retrieve the current location information:

- 1. Tap **Tap to start** on the widget of the main Home screen.
- 2. Read the message and tap **OK** to enable data connection.
- 3. Your phone will display the weather forecast for your current location.

To add a location:

- 1. Tap the weather image on the widget and then tap † > +.

Internet

Wi-Fi

The Wi-Fi settings menu lets you turn Wi-Fi on or off, set up and connect to available Wi-Fi networks, and configure advanced Wi-Fi options. For more information about the Wi-Fi settings, see Wi-Fi.

Mobile networks

By tapping **SIM** you can access the mobile network options for the SIM card installed in your phone.

► From the Network & internet screen, tap **SIM** to open the mobile network settings screen for your service provider's network.

Mobile data

Select whether to use a mobile network to access data.

Roaming

You can allow or disallow your phone to use mobile data services while it is roaming.

Roaming state

You can view your roaming status.

App data usage

Shows data usage over mobile connections by app over a period of time.

Data warning & limit

Set a target date for each month to reset data for the usage cycle, data warning, and data limit.

WARNING: The usage displayed is measured by your phone. Your carrier's data usage accounting may differ and the usage in excess of your data plan limit can result in charges. The data usage limit set in this menu is not guaranteed to prevent additional charges.

NOTE: Carrier data accounting may differ from device accounting.

Wi-Fi Calling

Wi-Fi Calling allows you to make and receive phone calls over a Wi-Fi connection. You need to activate Wi-Fi Calling manually if you want to use it.

- 1. From the Network & internet screen, tap SIM > Wi-Fi Calling.
- 2. Tap the on/off icon next to Use Wi-Fi Calling.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to turn Wi-Fi Calling on.

Automatically select network

You can choose whether the network will be selected automatically or not.

Choose network

You can choose the network you want to use.

Access Point Names

You can edit existing access points or add a new access point.

Airplane mode

Airplane mode disconnects your phone from all networks, so that your phone cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

► From the Network & internet screen, tap the on/off icon next to **Airplane mode** to turn it on or off. While in Airplane mode, the status bar will display ...

Mobile Hotspot & tethering

For details on your phone's Mobile Hotspot and tethering settings, see Mobile Hotspot & Tethering.

Data Saver

To help reduce data usage, Data saver prevents some apps from sending or receiving data in the background. If you do not want some apps to be restricted, you can select them in the Unrestricted data list.

Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

From your phone, you can add, set up, and manage virtual private networks (VPNs) that allow you to connect and access resources inside a secured local network, such as your corporate network. Depending on the type of VPN you are using at work, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your company's local network. You can get this information from your network administrator.

- 1. From the Network & internet screen, tap VPN.
- 2. Tap + and enter VPN profile > **SAVE**.
- 3. Tap the VPN connection you have added.
- 4. When prompted, enter your login credentials, and then tap **CONNECT**.
 - When you are connected, a VPN connected icon appears in the notification area.

Private DNS

Private DNS is a way to secure queries and responses between your phone and a website when your phone tries to get information from the website. You can configure your phone to connect to a private host.

- 1. From the Network & internet screen, tap **Private DNS**.
- 2. Tap one of available Private DNS modes.

NOTE: If you selected **Private DNS provider hostname**, enter the hostname you want to use.

3. Tap SAVE.

Adaptive connectivity

You can save battery life by enabling this function. Your phone will automatically switch from 5G to 4G when it thinks you wouldn't benefit from faster network and will turn on 5G only when you need increased speed, like when you stream or download videos.

Connected Devices

Your phone can connect to other devices as follows.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Connected devices** to open the Connected devices screen.

USB

Select which device will control the USB connection and the USB mode to be used during the connection.

NOTE: This menu appears only when the USB cable is connected between your phone and another device such as a PC.

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap USB.
- 2. Tap the item you want to set.

Pair new device

You can pair your phone with other Bluetooth enabled devices via Bluetooth. For details on your phone's Bluetooth settings, see Bluetooth.

Saved devices

View the list of devices to which the phone has previously connected via Bluetooth.

Connection preferences

You can see the status or configure the settings of listed devices or features.

Bluetooth

Your phone's Bluetooth capabilities let you use wireless headsets, send and receive pictures and files, and more. For details on your phone's Bluetooth settings, see Bluetooth.

NFC

The NFC (Near Field Communication) settings menu lets you turn NFC on or off. For more information about the NFC settings, see Near Field Communication (NFC) Technology.

Cast

You can connect your phone to devices that support Miracast to share displayed images via a connected Wi-Fi network.

Printing

You can print data from your phone.

Chromebook

You can see the connection status between your phone and your Chromebook™ if you have one.

Nearby Share

Share photos, links, files, and more with a friend or family member using a compatible device nearby, by simply tapping the share button. For more information, please visit support.google.com/android/share.

Android Auto

You can use some practical apps on your car screen and control features like navigation and maps, calls and text messages, and music by plugging your phone into your car's Android Auto™ compatible USB port. For more information, please visit support.google.com/androidauto.

Codec preferences

You can configure the settings related to Qualcomm® aptX™ audio.

Apps

You can configure the settings for the applications used on your phone.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Apps** to open the Apps screen.

All apps

You can access the information of all apps installed on your phone.

► From the Apps screen, tap All apps and then tap an app you want to open the information screen.

- or -

From the Apps screen, tap an app under **Recently opened apps**.

– or –

From the Apps screen, tap **See all** [XX] **apps** and then tap an app. ([xx] is the total number of apps installed in your phone).

Default apps

If you have more than one app that does the same thing, you can pick which app to use by default.

Screen time

Allows you to check screen time and set app timers to limit daily usage.

Unused apps

Displays the list of apps you have not used recently.

Special app access

This menu allows you to set the special access right for some apps.

Notifications

You can manage the notification settings on this phone.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Notifications**.

App settings

Allows you to activate or deactivate notifications from individual applications.

Notification history

Shows recent and snoozed notifications.

Conversations

Allows you to configure notifications for new messages in your priority conversations.

Bubbles

Set whether or not to display conversations as floating icons on top of other apps.

Device & app notifications

Allows you to control which apps and devices can access notifications.

Notifications on lock screen

Select whether to display the contents of your notifications on the locked screen.

Sensitive notifications

Set whether or not sensitive contents will be shown when the phone is locked.

NOTE: This menu will not be displayed when None or Swipe is selected for the screen lock method.

Do Not Disturb

Set to allow only selected contacts or apps to notify you based on an optional predefined schedule. See Do Not Disturb.

Wireless emergency alerts

See Wireless emergency alerts.

Other notification settings

You can set other notification functions including **Hide silent notifications in status bar**, **Allow notification snoozing**, and **LED indicator**.

Battery

Monitor your phone's battery usage through this settings menu. View which functions are consuming your battery's charge and at what percentage. Also, your phone shows you a message about how well your apps are using the battery and suggests actions you can take if apps are using too much battery.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Battery**.

Battery usage

Shows how many hours and minutes the screen has been active since the last full charge.

Battery Saver

Allows you to control your phone's battery usage by offering some useful setting options.

Adaptive Battery

Battery Manager detects apps that are draining battery and allows you to restrict those apps.

WARNING: Restricted apps may not work properly and result in unwanted behavior such as delayed notifications.

Battery percentage

Set to display or not display the remaining battery percentage in status bar.

Battery Care Mode

Allows you to extend the overall life span of your phone's battery by preventing it from being charged above 85% of capacity.

IMPORTANT: If the battery is frequently charged when it is nearly full, it will wear out faster, reducing its cycle life. Battery cycle life is significantly increased when it is only charged to 85% of its capacity. When Battery Care Mode is "On", the phone will limit its fully charged state to 85% of capacity. When Battery Care Mode is "Off", the phone will charge the battery to 100% of capacity. Note that when Battery Care Mode is "On", it reduces your talk/standby time. However, Battery Care Mode is recommended for those who want to extend the battery's cycle life.

NOTE: When Battery Care Mode is "On", a battery icon accompanied by a heart will appear in the status bar. After a full charge, the battery level will still show 100%. This indicates 100% of a full charge and not 100% of the battery's capacity.

Programmable Key

You can set what the PTT/Programmable key will do for a single press, a double press, and a long press.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Programmable key** to open the Programmable key screen.

Assign a function to the PTT/Programmable key

- From the Programmable key screen, select Single press, Double press, or Press and hold.
- 2. Select a function or application you want to assign to the key.
 - Tap **Do nothing** if you do not want to assign any function to the key.

Answer and end call

You can answer and end calls with the PTT/Programmable key when you turn this option on.

Wake up device

If you turn this on and the screen is off, a long press on the PTT/Programmable key will turn on the phone's screen.

Storage

The Storage settings menu lets you manage the storage on your phone and provides options for your microSD card or other portable storage medias.

- 1. From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Storage** to open the Storage screen.
- 2. Tap very next to THIS DEVICE, SD CARD, or other to open the pull-down menu.
 - Tap Free up space to see some suggestions for freeing up space in your device and portable storage.

Device storage

You can see the availability and usage details of storage on your phone.

► From the Storage screen, select **THIS DEVICE** from the pull-down menu (if not selected) to see your internal storage information.

Portable storage

Manage your portable storage media, such as SD cards. You can see the card's size and available space, unmount or mount, view the card information and format (erase) the SD card.

- 1. From the Storage screen, select **SD CARD** from the pull-down menu to see your microSD card storage information.
- 2. Tap to access the following options:
 - Rename to change the name.
 - Eject to unmount the microSD card or Mount to mount it.

NOTE: It is important to unmount the card before removing it from your phone to avoid corrupting the data on the card.

• Format to format the SD card.

IMPORTANT: The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSD card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved. To prevent the loss of important data, please check the contents before you format the card.

Sound & vibration

The Sound settings menu lets you control your phone's sound.

► From the Apps launcher, tap Settings > Sound & vibration to open the Sound & vibration screen.

Volume settings

Drag the slider to left or right as desired to adjust the **Media volume**, **Call volume**, **Ring & notification volume**, and **Alarm volume**.

Do Not Disturb

Sets some or all sounds and vibrations to be muted for a certain period of time you schedule.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap **Do Not Disturb**.
- 2. Set available options if necessary.

Phone ringtone

Assign a ringtone to your incoming calls.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap **Phone ringtone**.
- 2. Tap a ringtone in the available list.

- or -

Tap **Add ringtone** to select a sound file. After being added to the available list, tap it.

- 3. The ringtone briefly plays when selected.
- 4. Tap **OK** to assign the phone ringtone.

Live Caption

See Live Caption.

Media

Sets to show media player in the Quick Settings panel.

Vibration pattern

Select a vibration pattern for your phone.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap Vibration pattern.
- 2. Tap a vibration pattern in the available list. Your phone briefly vibrates when selected.
- 3. Tap **OK** to assign the vibration pattern.

Vibration & haptics

Adjust your phone's vibration and haptic feedback intensities and other settings.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap **Vibration & haptics**.
- 2. Tap the Use vibration & haptics on/off icon to turn it on.
 - Tap Vibrate first then ring gradually to set it for calls.
 - Drag the slider to left or right as desired to adjust the intensity of Ring vibration,
 Notification vibration, Alarm vibration, Touch feedback, and Media vibration.

Default notification sound

Select a sound for notifications. See Phone ringtone for setting procedure.

Default alarm sound

Select a sound for alarms. See Phone ringtone for setting procedure.

Other sounds and vibrations

Configure other sound settings in function of your needs.

• Tap the on/off icon to turn on or off such items as **Dial pad tones**, **Screen locking sound**, **Vibrate on keypress**, etc.

Emergency dialpad tone

You can set the tone for the emergency dialing keypad which appears on the lock screen when the lock screen is enabled.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap **Emergency dialpad tone**.
- 2. Select from Silent, Tone, or Vibration.

NOTE: When **Ring & notification volume** is set to vibrate **IIII**, the Emergency dialpad tone will not sound even when **Tone** is set in this menu.

Display

Adjusting your phone's display settings not only helps you see what you want, but it can also help increase battery life.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Display**.

Brightness level

Manually adjust the screen brightness for the current lighting conditions by dragging the slider to left or right.

Adaptive brightness

Enable or disable Adaptive brightness. If Adaptive brightness is enabled, it will automatically adjust the brightness depending on the amount of light in your surroundings. If you adjust the brightness manually, Adaptive brightness will learn from your selection and take that into account for the future.

Lock screen

You can configure the lock screen display settings.

Screen timeout

Select the delay time before the screen automatically turns off.

Dark theme

See Dark theme.

Screen saver

You can select a screen saver for your phone.

Display size and text

You can adjust the display and font sizes by dragging the slider to left or right and set other text-related options. See Display size and text.

Night Light

Tints your screen amber and allows you to schedule the time when to turn on or off.

Glove touch mode

When Glove touch mode is set to on, the phone increases the sensitivity of the screen to improve touch detection through the glove material.

Pocket mode

Set to prevent unintended touch operation in your pocket or bag.

Auto-rotate screen

Your phone is capable of automatically changing the orientation of some onscreen content. With this feature, you can view the screen in either portrait or landscape orientation by turning the phone sideways.

Display quick settings

Set to display or not display quick settings items in notifications panel.

Wallpaper & Style

Personalize your phone by selecting your favorite style. See Wallpaper & style.

Accessibility

The Accessibility menu lets you enable and manage accessibility-related applications.

From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Accessibility** to open the Accessibility screen.

NOTE: After selecting each Accessibility menu, scroll down to find information about the feature and read it carefully before turning on the feature.

Downloaded apps

This menu provides you with the list of accessibility-related applications. The applications displayed may vary depending on the applications installed on your phone.

Select to Speak

Select to Speak reads aloud any text that you can tap on such as documents, emails, text messages, text on websites and text labels throughout the device interface.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Select to Speak**.
- To turn it on, tap the Select to Speak shortcut on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap ALLOW > GOT IT.
- 3. Tap and then tap the item you want to be read out. To hear multiple items, drag your finger across the screen. Tap if you want to hear everything on the screen.
 - Tap Select to Speak shortcut to change the shortcut item.
 - Tap Settings to configure its settings.

TalkBack

TalkBack provides spoken feedback to help visually impaired users.

NOTE: When TalkBack is turned on, you need to take different actions to operate the touchscreen. When you tap on an item, a green outline appears. Then, double tap the item to select it. To slide the screen, slide with two fingers instead of one.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Talkback**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the Use TalkBack on/off icon.
- 3. The first time you activate the feature, a series of informational screens may be shown. Tap on Next to outline the button, then double tap it to proceed to the next page. When you select Finish in the same manner on the last screen, the TalkBack feature will be set to on
- 4. To turn TalkBack off, tap the **Use TalkBack** on/off icon, double tap it, tap **STOP**, and then double tap it.

– or –

Press and hold both volume keys for a few seconds when the **TalkBack shortcut** is turned on with the **Hold volume keys** option enabled.

– or –

Tap and double tap it when the **TalkBack shortcut** is turned on with the **Tap** accessibility button option enabled.

- Tap TalkBack shortcut to change the shortcut item.
- Tap Settings to configure its settings.

Display size and text

► From the Accessibility screen, tap **Display size and text** to open the Display size and text screen.

Font size

Adjust the font size on the screen.

From the Display size and text screen, drag the slider left or right to adjust the font size.

Display size

Adjust the display size on the screen.

► From the Display size and text screen, drag the slider left or right to adjust the display size.

Bold text

Changes to bold font to improve visibility.

High contrast text

Changes the color of all onscreen text to either dark or light to make it easier to read. The specific text color shown will depend on the original text color.

Color and motion

► From the Accessibility screen, tap **Color and motion** to open the Color and motion screen.

Color correction

Allows you to select a correction mode to adjust the color of the screen to suit your preference.

- 1. From the Color and motion screen, tap **Color correction**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use color correction** on/off icon.

- 3. Tap the desired correction mode.
- 4. Tap the Color correction shortcut on/off icon, read the confirmation message, and tap GOT IT.
 - Tap Color correction shortcut to change the shortcut item.

Color inversion

Allows you to exchange the colors of the items on the screen. Light areas will appear dark and dark areas appear light. For example, black text on a white screen becomes white text on a black screen.

- 1. From the Color and motion screen, tap **Color inversion**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use color inversion** on/off icon.
- Tap the Color inversion shortcut on/off icon, read the confirmation message, and tap GOT IT.
 - Tap Color inversion shortcut to change the shortcut item.

Dark theme

Allows you to make your phone's background darker. Some of the possible benefits of the dark theme include conserving battery power, reducing eye strain, and facilitating use in low-light environments.

- 1. From the Color and motion screen, tap **Dark theme**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use Dark theme** on/off icon.
- 3. Tap **Schedule** to set to switch the Dark theme on or off automatically based on a schedule. The following options are available:
 - None to turn it on or off manually.
 - Turns on at custom time to set a Start time and an End time to suit your needs.
 - Turns on from sunset to sunrise to turn it on every night.
 - Turns on at bedtime to turn it on when bedtime mode is on.

Remove animations

Removes animations, for example, screens will no longer fade in and out when transitioning from one app to another.

Large mouse pointer

Enlarges the size of the mouse pointer to make it easier to see.

Extra dim

Dims your screen beyond your phone's typical minimum brightness level in order to be more comfortable to read.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Extra dim**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Make screen extra dim** on/off icon.
- 3. Drag the intensity slider left or right to adjust the light dimmer or brighter.
- 4. Tap the **Keep on after device restarts** on/off icon to maintain this setting even after restarting the phone.
- 5. Tap the **Extra dim shortcut** on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap **GOT**
 - Tap Extra dim shortcut to change the shortcut item.

Magnification

Allows you to zoom the screen in and out by tapping, long pressing, pinching, or dragging with two fingers.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap Magnification.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Magnification shortcut** on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap **GOT IT**.
 - Tap Magnification shortcut to change the shortcut item.
 - Tap Magnification type to switch between full and partial screen to magnify.
 - Tap Magnify typing to use the magnifier to follow text as you type.

Accessibility menu

Provides a large onscreen menu to control your phone.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Accessibility Menu**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Accessibility Menu shortcut** on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap **ALLOW** > **GOT IT**.
 - Tap Accessibility Menu shortcut to change the shortcut item.
 - Tap Settings to configure its settings.

Switch Access

Switch Access allows you to interact with your phone using one or more switches instead of the touchscreen. Switch Access can be helpful if you cannot interact directly with the device. Use switches to select items, scroll, type, and more.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap Switch Access.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use Switch Access** on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap **ALLOW**.
- 3. The setup guide automatically shows up, then follow the onscreen instructions to finish set up.
- Tap the Switch Access shortcut on/off icon, read the confirmation message and tap GOT IT.
 - Tap Switch Access shortcut to change the shortcut item.
 - Tap Settings to configure its settings.

Vibration & haptics

Configure the vibration and haptic feedback settings for your phone.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap Vibration & haptics.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use vibration & haptics** on/off icon.
 - Tap Vibrate first then ring gradually to set the vibration for calls.
 - Drag the slider to left or right as desired to adjust the intensity of Ring vibration,
 Notification vibration, Alarm vibration, Touch feedback, and Media vibration.

Timing controls

▶ From the Accessibility screen, tap **Timing controls** to open the Timing controls screen.

Touch & hold delay

Set the length of delay to be used in the touch and hold operation.

- 1. From the Timing controls screen, tap **Touch & hold delay**.
- 2. Select your desired setting.

Time to take action (Accessibility timeout)

Choose how long to show messages asking you to take action.

- From the Timing controls screen, tap Time to take action (Accessibility timeout).
- 2. Select your desired setting.

NOTE: This setting does not apply in all apps.

Autoclick (dwell timing)

You can set the cursor to take action automatically when the cursor stops moving for a certain amount of time if you are using a mouse.

- 1. From the Timing controls screen, tap Autoclick (dwell timing).
- 2. Select your desired setting.
 - When you select **Custom**, tap the or + icon at each end of the slider to set the delay time longer or shorter.

System controls

► From the Accessibility screen, tap **System controls** to open the System controls screen.

System navigation

Configure the system navigation options for your phone, such as how to display your Home screen.

- 1. From the System controls screen, tap **System navigation**.
- 2. Select Gesture navigation or 3-button navigation.
 - Tap to set Digital assistant and Back Sensitivity for Gesture navigation.

One-handed mode

Shrinks the screen size and allows you to use your phone with just one thumb.

NOTE: To use this feature, make sure that **Gesture navigation** is turned on in System navigation settings. See System navigation.

- 1. From the System controls screen, tap **One-handed mode**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use one-handed mode** on/off icon.
- 3. Swipe down from the bottom edge of the screen to use the one-handed mode.
- 4. Tap the **One-handed mode shortcut** on/off icon, read the confirmation message, and tap **GOT IT**.
 - Select which action you want to take by using the shortcut, Pull screen into reach or Show notifications.
 - Tap One-handed mode shortcut to change the shortcut item.

Power button ends call

Set your phone to end calls when the Power key is pressed.

NOTE: This function does not work to reject incoming calls.

Auto-rotate screen

Set whether or not to rotate the screen automatically when you change your phone's orientation.

NOTE: In some apps or menus, the screen may not rotate regardless of this setting.

Live Caption

Live Caption detects speech on your device and automatically captions it on media like videos, podcasts, phone and video calls, and audio messages. This function is available only for English.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Live Caption**.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Use Live Caption** on/off icon.
 - To move the caption box, touch and hold it, then drag up or down.
 - To hide captions and turn off Live Caption, drag the caption box off the bottom of your screen.
 - To expand or contract the caption box, double-tap it. This option does not work while you're on a call.
- 3. You can configure the following settings:
 - Tap the Hide profanity on/off icon to hide or show vulgar language.
 - Tap the Show sound labels on/off icon to show or hide sound labels, such as laughter and applause.
 - Tap the Live Caption in volume control on/off icon to show or hide the Live Caption button when you press the volume keys. Then, you can turn off the function by tapping
 .

Caption preferences

You can customize the language and the style of the displayed captions.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap Caption preferences.
- 2. To turn it on, tap the **Show captions** on/off icon.
- Configure the settings under Caption size and style and More options according to your needs.

Audio description

Enabling the Audio description, you can hear a description of what's happening onscreen in supported movies and shows. Only available for apps that support Audio description.

Hearing aids - telecoil mode

Hearing aid mode was designed for hearing aids that have a telecoil. To use the telecoil function in your phone, you will need to set the Hearing aid mode to on.

From the Accessibility screen, tap the **Hearing aids** on/off icon to turn on or off.

Audio adjustment

► From the Accessibility screen, tap Audio adjustment.

Mono audio

Set the audio output to mono when playing audio.

Audio balance

Adjust the audio balance by using the onscreen slider and by hearing a sound clip which will play when you tap on the slider.

Accessibility shortcuts

► From the Accessibility screen, tap **Accessibility shortcuts** to open the Accessibility shortcuts screen.

Accessibility button

Allows you to quickly access accessibility features from any screen.

- 1. From the Accessibility shortcuts screen, tap **Accessibility button**.
- 2. Configure the following settings:
 - Location to select Floating over other apps or Navigation bar.
 - Size to select Small or Large.
 - Fade when not in use to set the button to become dim when not in use.
 - Transparency when not in use to adjust the degree of the transparency of the button when not in use.

NOTE: If the **System navigation** is set to **Gesture navigation** in the **System controls** settings, this menu will be called **Accessibility button & gesture** and some of the submenu items will be different from those described here. See **System navigation**.

Shortcut from lock screen

Set this on to allow the volume key shortcut to turn on the accessibility feature from the lock screen.

Text-to-speech output

Your phone can convert text into speech in certain downloaded applications. You may select the language you hear or adjust its speed.

- 1. From the Accessibility screen, tap **Text-to-speech output**.
- 2. Set Preferred engine, Language, Speech rate and Pitch.
 - PLAY: Play a short demonstration of the set speech synthesis.
 - RESET: Reset both Speech rate and Pitch to default.
 - Tap to configure its settings if necessary.

Security

The security settings menu lets you choose screen lock options and configure password visibility, administrator settings, and credential storage options.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Security** to open the Security screen.

Security status

Shows you the status of your security apps.

Screen lock

Allows you to lock your phone's screen and enhance the security feature through various options.

- From the Security screen, tap **Screen lock**.
- **IMPORTANT:** Highest security level protection (password protection) and frequent change of password are recommended to protect your phone and data from unauthorized access.

NOTE: When you change the screen lock option, you may be asked to choose how you want notifications to show on the lock screen depending on the previous screen lock settings. In that case, follow the onscreen instructions.

- None: There is no security.
- **Swipe**: There is no security using the Swipe option.
- Pattern: There is medium security using a Pattern. Follow the onscreen instructions to set.
- PIN: There is medium to high security using a number of 4 or more digits. Follow the onscreen instructions to set.

 Password: There is high security using a strong password. Follow the onscreen instructions to set.

Screen lock settings

You can change the following screen lock-related settings:

NOTE: This menu will not be displayed when **None** or **Swipe** is selected. The available settings menus may vary depending on the screen lock option you have selected.

From the Security screen, tap inext to Screen lock.

Make pattern visible

You can hide the trace of your pattern as you draw it. This setting appears only when you set Screen lock type to Pattern.

Lock after screen timeout

Sets the time delay to activate the screen lock feature after the device enters sleep mode. This setting is available only when you have enabled one of the lock settings.

Power button instantly locks

Activates the screen lock feature by pressing the Power key. This setting appears only when you set one of the lock settings.

Face and fingerprint unlock

► From the Security screen, tap Face & Fingerprint Unlock.

Face Unlock

You can use your face to unlock your phone. To set up face unlock, follow the onscreen instructions.

IMPORTANT: Face authentication technology does not guarantee completely accurate personal authentication and identification. Kyocera assumes no responsibility for any damages resulting from a third party using your device or inability to use your device.

NOTES:

- Using your face to unlock your phone is less secure than using a pattern, PIN, or password. It may be possible for your phone to be unlocked by someone or something with similar appearance to the registered user's face.
- Face unlock may not work properly in a dark environment.
- Make sure your face is fully visible and not covered by any object, such as a mask, hat, or sunglasses.

TIP: You can combine face unlock with **Lift to wake** for a smoother unlock action. Once both features are set up, just by lifting the phone from the table and bringing it up to your face, the phone will be unlocked and ready to use. See **Lift to wake**.

Fingerprint

Enabling this option allows you to touch the fingerprint sensor to unlock the screen. Follow the onscreen instructions to set.

IMPORTANT: Fingerprint authentication technology does not guarantee completely accurate personal authentication and identification. Kyocera assumes no responsibility for any damages resulting from a third party using your device or inability to use your device.

NOTES:

- Please remove the USB cable prior to registering your fingerprint for authentication.
- If you fail fingerprint authentication five times, input your backup PIN, pattern, or password.
- Fingerprint cannot be used to unlock the screen after restarting the phone. You must use your backup method, such as pattern, PIN, or password.
- The fingerprint sensor is on the back of your phone. Before using the fingerprint sensor, make sure the fingerprint sensor and your finger are clean and dry.
- The fingerprint recognition performance depends on your usage. The phone may have an issue in registering or recognizing fingerprints that have scars or worn down ridges, or if there are scratches on the sensor surface.

Unlocking your phone

You can set to use your face and fingerprint to unlock your phone.

Authentication in apps

You can set to use your face and fingerprint as biometric credentials to sign in to apps.

More security settings

Smart Lock

You can automatically unlock your phone without using your PIN, pattern or password.

Device admin apps

You can enable or disable the authority of certain applications to be a device administrator. If disabled, you will typically lose some functionality in those applications, such as the ability to sync new email or calendar events with your phone.

Encryption & credentials

To protect data in your phone, system data stored inside the phone is encrypted by default. You can encrypt the data in the SD card installed in your phone and view or manage the credentials through this menu.

Trust agents

Manages trust agents for features like Smart Lock.

App pinning

Turn on to keep your current app in view on your phone.

Covert mode

This feature makes your phone effectively unnoticeable even in a silent and dark environment by shutting down completely all visible and audible alerts and notifications.

NOTE: The sound and LEDs from Bluetooth devices connected to the phone may not be disabled even when Covert mode is on.

Privacy

You can access and adjust all your privacy preferences from this menu.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Privacy**.

Privacy dashboard

Shows which apps have used permissions recently.

Permission manager

Shows a list of permission types and which apps have or do not have that permission. You can change an app's permission setting through this menu. See Permission.

Camera access

You can disable camera access on your phone.

Microphone access

You can disable microphone access on your phone. However, your microphone data may still be shared when you call an emergency number.

Show passwords

Set whether or not to briefly display the numbers or letters as you are entering a PIN or Password.

Notifications on lock screen

Select whether to display the contents of your notifications on the locked screen.

Android System Intelligence

You can learn about device learning services which offer you personalized suggestions by using information from your phone or Google Account. This menu also allows you to select whether or not to see smart text suggestions with your keyboard and clear collected analytics data from your phone.

App content

Set to allow apps to send content to the Android system.

Show clipboard access

Notifies you when apps access contents you have copied, such as text or images.

Autofill service from Google

Lets you fill in passwords, addresses, and other information from your Google Account with a single tap.

Activity controls

Launches the activity controls within your Google account, so that you choose whether or not it will save your activity on Google sites and apps.

Ads

Allows you to control Ad behavior and to avoid being targeted by ads based on your activity on your phone.

Usage & diagnostics

Control whether or not your phone automatically sends diagnostic, device, and app usage data to Google.

Location

The Location services settings menu lets you decide whether to allow your phone to collect and use your phone's location information. Some apps may require location services be turned on for full functionality.

IMPORTANT: Your wireless phone can determine its (and your) physical, geographical location ("Location Information") and can associate Location Information with other data. Additionally, certain applications, services and programs are capable of accessing, collecting, storing and using Location Information and disclosing Location Information to others. You should use caution when determining whether or not Location Information should be made available to others and you should review any applicable third party privacy policies before providing access.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Location** to open the Location screen.

Use location

Tap the on/off icon to turn location on or off.

Recent access

Shows the list of apps which have recently requested access to your location information.

App location permissions

For each app installed on your phone, you can select whether or not the app can access the phone's location information.

Location services

Manage your phone's location-based services provided by Google.

► From the Location screen, tap **Location services**.

Emergency Location Service

See Emergency Location Service.

Wi-Fi scanning/Bluetooth scanning

You can let your phone scan for nearby Wi-Fi networks or Bluetooth devices in order to help apps and services get better location information.

You can also access other Google Location menus such as **Earthquake alerts**, **Google Location Accuracy**, **Google Location History**[™], and **Google Location Sharing**.

For more information about Google Location Services, visit support.google.com/android/location

Safety & Emergency

Use this feature to save and share your emergency information including your emergency contacts and medical information. Also, you can set up some very helpful safety measures on your phone.

► From the Apps launcher, tap **Settings** > **Safety & emergency** to open the Safety & emergency screen.

Personal Safety

Set up Personal Safety app.

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap **OPEN PERSONAL SAFETY**.
- 2. Choose an account if required.
- 3. Tap Add contact to register your emergency contacts and tap Next.

- 4. Enter/edit your personal data, such as Name, Blood type, and Allergies, and tap Done.
- 5. The following features are available. You may be required to update your location permission to use them:
 - Safety check to schedule a safety check on you. Whenever you need an extra safety precaution, such as when you are walking alone at night, set a check-in timer. After a specified time, an alert appears on your phone to do a check-in and confirm that you're okay. If you cannot response before the timer ends, Emergency sharing starts and alerts your designated contacts.
 - **Emergency sharing** to let your emergency contacts view your location and receive updates about where you are and your battery percentage.
 - Get alerts about nearby crises to be notified about public emergencies or local crises, like natural disasters.

Emergency information

To register your medical information:

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap **Medical information**.
- 2. Add or edit your personal information.

IMPORTANT: Emergency information you enter in this feature can help rescue workers, such as paramedics, police and hospital personnel identify you and your primary contacts in an emergency. However, with default settings they cannot access your private information without unlocking your phone. To change it, scroll down the screen and tap **Change setting** and tap the **Allow access emergency info** on/off icon to enable everyone who picks up your phone to see your personal information.

To register your emergency contacts:

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap **Emergency contacts**.
- 2. Tap Add contact.
- 3. Tap a contact name you want to register as an emergency contact.
 - To remove a contact from the Emergency contacts, tap **X** next to the contact you want to remove.

To access your emergency information when the screen is locked:

1. Press the **Power key** to turn the screen on.

- 2. Touch and hold and swipe toward to access the lock screen.
- 3. Tap EMERGENCY > View emergency info.
- 4. If required, tap **Tap to unlock and view info** and unlock the phone by using your set method.
 - Your medical information will be shown on the screen.
 - Tap \(\sum_{\text{next}} \) next to the contact to make a call.

Emergency SOS

If you're in an emergency situation, you can use your phone to trigger emergency actions like calling for help.

To turn on Emergency SOS:

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap **Emergency SOS**.
- 2. Tap the Use Emergency SOS on/off icon.
- 3. The following settings are available:
 - Tap Play alarm sound on/off icon to turn it on or off. When enabled, your phone will
 play a loud sound when Emergency SOS is starting.
 - Tap Call emergency services on/off icon to turn it on or off. When enabled, your phone will call to the registered emergency service when Emergency SOS is starting. To change the number to call for help, tap Call emergency services.
 - Tap Share info with emergency contacts on/off icon to turn it on or off. When enabled, your phone will text your real-time location to emergency contacts.
 - Tap Record emergency video on/off icon to turn it on or off. When enabled, your phone will record and share an emergency video.

To use Emergency SOS in an emergency situation:

IMPORTANT: Emergency SOS may not work in airplane mode.

- 1. On your phone, press the **Power key** 5 times or more.
- A 5 second countdown begins before emergency actions are started. If you triggered Emergency SOS by mistake, you can cancel the emergency actions during the countdown.
- 3. After the 5 second countdown, emergency actions are started.

Crisis alerts

Get notified about natural disasters and public emergencies affecting your area.

Emergency Location Service

When the Emergency Location Service (ELS) feature is activated, your device will automatically send your location to emergency responders when you call or text an emergency number.

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap **Emergency Location Service**.
- 2. Tap the Use Emergency Location Service on/off icon to turn it on or off.

Earthquake alerts

When an earthquake is detected nearby, you will get an alert with the initial estimated magnitude and distance from your location.

IMPORTANT: Earthquake alerts are not supported in all areas and not all earthquakes can be detected.

Silence notifications while driving

This feature automatically detects when you're at the wheel and prevents any notifications from distracting you by turning on Do Not Disturb feature.

Wireless emergency alerts

You can change the settings for Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA). WEA is a public safety system that allows you to receive geographically targeted, text-like messages warning you of imminent threats to safety in your area, such as dangerous weather, missing children, and other critical situations.

- 1. From the Safety & emergency screen, tap Wireless emergency alerts.
- 2. Tap the **Allow alerts** on/off icon to turn the emergency alerts on or off.
- 3. Configure the alert settings such as alerts type you want to receive (**Extreme threats**, **Severe threats**, **Public safety messages**, etc.) and alert preferences.

Passwords & Accounts

Add and manage all your email, social networking, and picture and video sharing accounts and save and manage your passwords.

Get a daily view of your digital habits, such as how frequently you use different apps, how many notifications you receive, or how often you check your phone or unlock your device.

Dashboard

You can set daily timers to limit your use of each app.

- - If you don't find it right away, tap Show all [xx] apps ([xx] is the total number of apps).
- 3. Choose how much time you can spend in that app, then tap **OK**.

Bedtime mode



Drying Your Phone

CAUTION! If your phone has been submerged in water, for example to use the camera in Underwater mode, rinse all surfaces of the phone thoroughly with clean, fresh water before drying.

- 1. Wipe down all outside surfaces of your phone with a clean lint-free cloth.
- 2. Tap the phone firmly, but gently on a clean dry cloth to remove moisture from the earpiece, microphone, and USB port. Repeat tapping each area about 20 times.



3. After removing all the water, let the phone dry completely at room temperature.

CAUTION! Excessive heat may damage your phone; never use a hair dryer, an oven, or any other appliance to dry out your phone.

NOTE: If your phone still retains some moisture, audio quality and speaker performance may be affected. Dry your phone completely before using it again.
