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
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
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Your Device

1.1 Overview





1 Left Soft Key

- Press to access Notifications in Home Screen
- Multifunction key within Applications and Menus

2 Messages

• Press to access messages

3 Call Key

- Make a call
- Press to Enter call log in Home Screen

4 Internal display

(5) Navigation Key (up, down, left, right)

- Press to change selections up, down, left, and right
- Press Right: Access Camera / Video
- Press Left: Access Pictures
- Press Up: Access Website
- Press Down: Access Settings

6 Right Soft Key

- Press to access Contacts in Home Screen
- Press to access Options within Applications and Menus

7 Back/Delete Key

- Move backwards through Menus
- Delete previous input

8 End/Power Key

Press to End a call, and return to the main screen

Press and hold to Power on/off

- Press to access Applications list in Home Screen
- Confirm and select options

(10) Key symbols

• Press * to choose a * or + symbol. Press the **Center Soft Key** ok to Lock the device.


(11) Letters symbols

- In Home Screen, press # to toggle vibrate.
- During keypad input, press to switch between numbers, upper case letters lower case letters, and predictive text. Press and hold to select a language.

1.2 Setting up your phone

Your phone may not have any SIM card pre-installed. MicroSD cards excluded as well. Optional microSD Memory Cards are supported (up to 128GB).

NOTE: Power off the device before opening the back cover to install a microSD Memory Card or replace the nano-SIM card.




Step 1. With the device facing down, remove the back cover from the bottom left corner. Use your fingernail to carefully lift the cover away from the device body.

Step 2. Remove the battery using your fingernail to lift from the top.




Step 3. To insert SIM card 1 or microSD card 2, push the SIM card or microSD card into the card slot with the gold-colored contacts facing down.



To remove the SIM card or microSD card, press down on the small plastic tab, then slide out the card. Do not use force or any sharp objects.


Step 4. Re-install the battery by aligning the gold contact points of the



battery with the gold contact points of the compartment. It only fits one way. Press down to position in place.

Step 5. Carefully align the back cover with tabs and press into place. It only fits one direction.

Step 6. Charge your phone fully before powering it on and starting the setup process.



WARNING: Only use the charger and cable supplied with the phone. Using incompatible chargers or tampering with the charging port could damage your phone.

1.3 Powering on your phone

Press and hold the **End/Power Key** until the phone powers on.

Setup your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you will be guided through the setup process. Additional settings can be configured in Settings:

- Select the phone's language, then press the **Right Soft Key** to go to the next step.
- You will see the Home Screen

Note: Even if no SIM card is installed, your phone will still power on and you will be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network and use some of the phone's features.


1.4 Powering off your phone

Press and hold the **End/Power Key** until the phone vibrates and powers off.

2 Phone call

2.1 Making a Call

Dial the desired number then press the **Call Key** to make the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the **Back/ Delete Key**



You can also press the **Left Soft Key** — to call

Press the **Right Soft Key** \supseteq to show more **Options**

- 1. Create new contact
- 2. Add to a contact
- 3. Send a message
- 4. Settings
- 5. Add 2-sec pause
- 6. Add wait
- 7. Call history

a) Make a call from your call log

From the Home Screen, press the Call Key ...

Enter the **Call Log** to access the call log and choose the contact you want to dial, then press the **Call Key**.

b) Make a call from Contacts

From the Home Screen, press the **Right Soft Key** —, Choose the contact



c) Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the Emergency Number and press the Call Key to make an Emergency Call. This works even without a SIM card or PIN code.

d) Make an international call

To dial an international call, press and hold to enter "+" in the dial screen, then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number, then press the Call Kev

e) Calling your voicemail

Press and hold key to call and listen to your voicemail.

f) Setting up voicemail

- Press and hold the key to call into your voicemail system.
- Follow the prompts for setup instructions.

g) Checking voicemail

From your phone:

- 1. Press and hold the key to call into your voicemail system.
- 2. Follow the prompts.


From other phones:

- 1. Dial your wireless number.
- 2. When you hear the greeting, press * to interrupt.
- 3. Follow the instructions. Contact your operator to confirm service availability.

NOTE: Your voicemail inbox is not protected until you create a passcode by following the setup prompts. Voicemail may not be available in some areas. Follow the setup instructions to password protect your voicemail inbox.

2.2 Answering or rejecting a call

During an incoming call:



- Open the flip to answer, if Flip open to answer is On. Otherwise,
- Press the **Left Soft Key** or **Call Key** to answer.
- Press the **Right Soft Key** or the **End/Power Key** to Hang up.
- Press the **Center Soft Key** to reject the call by sending a preset message.
- To mute the ringtone during an incoming call, press the Volume Up/Down Key.


2.3 Hanging up a call

During a call:

- Open the flip and press the **End/Power Key** to end the call.
- Open the flip and then close the flip to end the call.

3 Contacts

Contacts enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.



From the Home Screen, press the **Center Soft Key** or and select **Contacts** to enter the contact list.


3.1 Adding a Contact

On the Contacts screen, Press **Left Soft Key** \bigcirc to create a **New** Contact and enter the contact information.

When finished, press the **Left Soft Key** — to save.

3.2 Viewing a Contact

On the Contacts screen, use the **Navigation Key** to select a Contact, then press the **Center Soft Key** to access the contact's details.




- a) Press the Left Soft Key or Center Soft Key or to make a call.
- b) Press the **Right Soft Key** to access the **Options**: Send a message,

Edit, Delete and Share.

3.3 Editing a Contact

On the Contacts screen, using the **Navigation Key** to select a Contact, then press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, select **Edit contact** and press the **Center Soft Key** or to edit.

When finished, press the **Left Soft Key** to save.



3.4 Sharing a Contact

You can share a single contact with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Email, Messages, or Bluetooth.

On the Contacts screen, use the **Navigation Key** to select a Contact, then press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, and then select **Share**.

3.5 Deleting Contacts

On the Contacts screen, use the **Navigation Key** to view available contacts and the **Center Soft Key** or to make your selection, and then press the **Right Soft Key** to select **Delete**.

3.6 Import/Export Contacts

On the Contacts screen, press the **Right Soft Key** — to access **Options**.

- Select Import contacts to import contacts from internal storage to phone.
- Select Settings > Export contacts to export contacts from phone to internal storage.

4 Messages

Press the Messages Key, or from the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key and select Messaging to enter Messages.

4.1 Sending a Text Message (SMS)

Press Left Soft Key New to create a new message, input desired phone number and message. Press Left Soft Key to send out.



- Press the **Left Soft Key** to write a new message.
- Enter the phone number of the recipient in the "To:" bar or press the **Left Soft Key** to add recipients.
- Use the Navigation Key to go to the SMS/MMS message entry bar to enter the content of the message.
- Press ** Key to switch between the different input methods.
- Press ** Key to select symbols.
- Press the **Left Soft Key** to send messages.

4.2 Sending a Multimedia Message (MMS)

Press the Right Soft Key _ to access Options.

MMS enables you to send multimedia content including videos, pictures, photos, contacts and sounds to other compatible phones.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or email addresses are added.

An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as multiple SMS messages. Special characters may reduce the total available character length of each SMS message. This may cause an increase in the number of SMS messages sent to your recipient.

5 Camera

Your mobile phone features Photo and Video capture ability.

5.1 Accessing the Camera

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select Camera.

5.2 Take a picture

Position the object or scene in the screen and press the **Center Soft Key** to take the Photo. Photos will be automatically saved to the Multimedia application under Picture.

After taking a Photo, press the **Left Soft Key** — to preview.

5.3 Zoom in/out

Press Up or Down of the **Navigation Key** to zoom in and out.

Press the **Right Soft Key** to access options, and press Left or Right on the **Navigation Key** to toggle available options:


- Camera Resolution: Select the resolution as 2M, 1M.
- Self-Timer: Sets a delay for Photo capture after pressing the Center Soft
 Key

5.4 Accessing the Video

- Press Left and Right on the Navigation Key to switch between Photo and Video mode.
- Press Up or Down of the **Navigation Key** to zoom in and out.
- Press the Center Soft Key or to record a Video, and press again to stop recording. Videos will be automatically saved to the Multimedia application under Video.

6 Browser

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** from the Home Screen and select browser



7 Multimedia

The Multimedia application provides you with Pictures, Music, Video, FM Radio, Sound recorder.



To access this application, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select Multimedia.

Press the **Navigation Key** to switch application function that you want.

7.1 Picture

The Multimedia Picture app provides you with one location to view and organize all your saved photos.

To access this function, press the Center Soft Key or from the Home

Screen and select Multimedia > Picture.

Press the **Navigation Key** to select the picture list.

Use the **Navigation Key** to select an image and press the **Center Soft Key** to confirm, then press the **Right Soft Key** to access options below:

- Delete: Delete the selected photo.
- Edit: Select this option to rotate or crop the photo.
- Share: Share the photo via Messages or Bluetooth.
- Select Multiple: Allows you to select several photos in the Gallery.
- **Details:** Displays the file path, size and resolution.
- Set as: Set the photo as Wallpaper or Image for existing contact.

7.2 Music

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select Multimedia > Music. Using this menu, you can play music files stored on phone storage in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from your computer to phone using a USB cable.

7.3 Video

Video acts as a media player for you to view videos.

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select **Multimedia > Video**

- Use the **Navigation Key** to select a video, press the **Center Soft Key**ok to play the video.
- Press the Right Soft Key

 to access Options.

7.4 FM Radio

Your phone is equipped with an FM radio. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved stations or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select **Multimedia > FM Radio**.

To use it, you must plug in your wired headset, which works as an FM receiving antenna. FM Radio performance may reduce when using


headphones with shielded audio cables.

7.5 Sound Recorder.

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** from the Home Screen and select **Multimedia > Sound Recorder.**

- Press the Center Soft Key or to start recording and press the Center Soft Key or to end recording.
- Press the **Right Soft Key** and use the **Navigation Key** to select the recording, then press the **Center Soft Key** to play.
- Press the **Right Soft Key** \longrightarrow to access Options, such as delete, share, rename or details.

8 Tools



8.1 Calendar

Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, reminders or appointments.

To access this function, press the Center Soft Key or from the Home

Screen and select Tools > Calendar.



a) Create New Event

Press the **Left Soft Key** to add new events from any Calendar view.

- Fill in all required information for a new event. If it is a whole day event, you can press the **Center Soft Key** or to select **All-day**.
- When finished, press the **Left Soft Key** to save.

b) Delete and Edit Event

After new event is created, under Month view or Day view, use the Navigation Key to move to the event. Press the Center Soft Key to show the events list, then press the Right Soft Key to delete or press the Left Soft Key to edit.

More options are available by pressing the **Right Soft Key** — from the Calendar main screen:

- Today: Quickly navigate to the current day.
- Settings: Configure Calendar settings.

c) Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the event time arrives.

8.2 Calculator

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen and select **Tools > Calculator**



- > 0-9 key: Input numbers
- > * key: "."
- ➤ Navi key: +, -, x, ÷
- > □ : =
- ➤ Left Soft Key =: Clear
- > Right Soft Key = : Options

8.3 Clock

To access this function, press the **Center Soft Key** from the Home Screen and select **Tools > Clock**

Press **Navigation Key (Left, Right)** to switch between Alarm, Timer, Stopwatch, Clock.

a) Set Alarm

Press the **Right Soft Key** \equiv to add a new alarm. Select Hour, Minutes, AM/PM, then press OK.

For additional settings, press **Left Soft Key** \subseteq to Edit. The following options will appear:

- Turn alarm on: Toggle on/off alarm.
- Time: Select to set the alarm time.
- Repeat: Select the days you want your alarm to go off.
- Alarm sounds: Select a ringtone for the alarm.
- Delete Alarm: Delete an alarm.

Press the **Back Key** Save and go back.

b) Set Timer

Press the **Navigation Key** (Up, Down) to select and edit hours, minutes and seconds. When finished, press the **Center Soft Key** or to start the Timer.

- When the Timer is ongoing, press the **Center Soft Key** or to pause and continue the Timer.
- When the Timer is paused, press the **Left Soft Key** to reset the Timer.

c) To Set the Stopwatch

- Press the **Center Soft Key** or to start Stopwatch.
- When the Stopwatch is ongoing, press the **Right Soft Key** to record the lap, press the **Center Soft Key** to pause the time.
- When the Stopwatch is paused, press the **Center Soft Key** or to continue the total time, press the **Left Soft Key** to reset the stopwatch and clear lap times.

d) Clock

• press the **Left Soft Key** for ALL to select the world time of each region. Press **Back Key** to check all selected times.

9 Applications



9.1 E-Mail

a) Setup E-Mail

You can access this function by pressing the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen, select Applications and select **E-Mail**

Email account setup will guide you through the steps to set up an email account. Select next to continue.

- Enter the name and email for the account you want to set up.
- Press the Navigation Key and select NEXT to continue to the next step. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to manually setup your email.
- To add another email account, press the Right Soft Key
 to access
 Options > Settings, then select Add.

b) Send E-Mail

- Press the **Left Soft Key** to compose a new email from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field, then press the
 Center Soft Key ok to confirm and add new recipient(s).
- Type the subject and the content of the message. You may use your voice to enter the subject and content of your emails by pressing and holding the
 Center Soft Key ok button.
- If necessary, press the **Right Soft Key** to Add cc/bcc or Add attachments to the message.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can press the Right
 Soft Key and select Save as draft to save a copy.
- When ready to send, press the **Left Soft Key** to send.

9.2 File Manager

From the Home Screen press the **Center Soft Key** ok, select **Applications** and select **File Manager**.

File Manager displays all data stored on the phone and the microSD Memory

Card, including applications, downloaded media files, content from other locations, videos, pictures or audio you have captured, and any other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB Cable or by network.

When you download an application from PC to phone/microSD card, you can locate the application using File Manager, then select it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be efficient with the following common operations create (sub) folders and open view, rename, move, copy,delete, play, and share saved files.

9.3 Note


Press the **Center Soft Key** or from the Home Screen, select Applications and select **Note**

- Press the **Left Soft Key** to add a new note, then enter contents, then press the **Left Soft Key** to **Save**.
- On the notes list, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, such as delete, share and select notes.
- Use the **Navigation Key** to select the note, and press the **Center Soft Key**To view details or edit. Press the **Right Soft Key**to delete or share the note via Email, Messages or Bluetooth.

10 Setting

From the Home Screen press the **Center Soft Key** ok, select Settings . You will the following options:

10.1 Wireless & Network



Select Wireless & Network and press Center Soft Key or to access.

a) Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi will allow you to surf the internet without using your mobile network when in range of a wireless network.

Press the Center Soft Key ok to enter Wi-Fi.

- Press the Up and Down of the **Navigation Key** to select **On**, then press the **Center Soft Key** to turn on Wi-Fi.
- Press the Up and Down of the Navigation Key to select Available networks, then press the Center Soft Key to enter the available networks list, select one and press the Center Soft Key to configure the access point and connect your phone. Be advised you may need to enter a password if applicable.
- Press the Up and Down of the Navigation Key to select Wi-Fi
 preferences and Saved networks, then press the Center Soft Key
 to set more options.

b) Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) with other Bluetooth devices within a close range such as another phone, computer, printer, headset, etc.

Press the Center Soft Key ok to enter Bluetooth.

Press the Up and Down of the Navigation Key to select On, then

press the **Center Soft Key** to turn on Bluetooth.

Use Bluetooth: Press the **Center Soft Key** to turn on/off.

- Device Name: Press the **Center Soft Key** or to enter, edit the name then press the **Navigation Key** to select RENAME to save.
- Pair Devices: Press the Center Soft Key or to enter nearby devices list, using the Up and Down of the Navigation Key to select a needed device, press the Center Soft Key or to confirm.

c) Mobile Network

Press the Center Soft Key or to enter Mobile network.

- Mobile date: Access data using mobile network. Press Center Soft
 Key ok to turn on/off
- Roaming: Connect to data services when roaming. Press Center
 Soft Key or to turn on/off.
- APP data usage: Access and see each APP data usage value.
- Data warning & limit: Access and set the data warning on/off, data limit on/off, data limit value.
- Preferred network type: Access and set LTE type.
- Wi-Fi calling: To disable and enable Wi-Fi calling.

d) Airplane Mode

When Airplane mode is on, all wireless connections are disabled simultaneously, including Wi-Fi and Bluetooth.

Press the Center Soft Key or to turn on/off.

e) Tethering and Mobile Hotspot

 Mobile Hotspot: Turn your phone into a portable Wi-Fi Hotspot so you can share your mobile data connection with other devices.

Press the **Center Soft Key** or to turn on/off.

Note: First time to set, you need to set the spot name and password, then save. Not necessary after first setting.

• USB tethering: Connect your phone to a computer using the USB

cable and turn on the USB tethering to share the data connection.

Note: Only once USB is connected can this feature be activated.

- Mobile Hotspot Setting: Setting Hotspot name, password, Maximum connections, and preferred channel.
- Mobile Hotspot turn off timer: Access and select by pressing
 Center Soft Key or and set an idle time to turn off the hotspot.

f) Data Saver

Data Saver feature can be turned on or off by the user. If it is on, application performance may be enhanced for low- or no-data access.

g) USB

There are several modes for to select from, including Charging only, File transfer, USB tethering, MIDI, PTP and No data transfer.

h) 10.1.8 VPN (Virtual Private Network)

Press the **Left Soft Key** to add a new VPN.

Enter the required VPN information and when finished, select Save.

i) Files received via Bluetooth

This showed the details of transferring history through Bluetooth.

10.2 APPs

All applications will be listed here whether they are from System or Downloaded. Press **Navigation Key** to select and **Center Soft Key** to access. Open, Disable and Force stop are available options.

Notifications: Turn on/off to toggle application notifications.

10.3 Sounds

a) To adjust Volume:

- Call Volume: Press the Volume Up/Down button on the right side of the device to adjust the Ringtone & Alerts volume. You can also use the Navigation Key (Left, Right)
- Ring & notification & alarm: Press the Navigation Key (Left, Right)

b) To adjust ringtones

- Press the Center Soft Key ok to access.
- Press the Navigation Key (Up, Down)
- Press OK to save.

c) Sound > Tones.

- Under Tones, you may select your preferences on Vibrate, Ringtones,
 Notification Alerts and Manage Tones.
- Press the Center Soft Key ok to confirm.

d) To adjust Other Sounds

All other sounds that are related to Dial Pad or Camera can be adjusted by doing the following:

• From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key ok, select Settings > Sound > Other Sounds.

10.4 Display

a) To adjust Brightness

- Press the Navigation Key to select Brightness.
- Select desired brightness by pressing the Left or Right of the Navigation Key.

b) To adjust Wallpaper

- From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key [○κ], select ⑤ Settings > Display > Wallpaper.
- Press Picture to select from Images that are stored on your device.
- Press Camera to take a picture for the Wallpaper you would like to use/store.
- Press Wallpapers to select from pre-loaded Wallpapers.

c) To adjust Screen timeout

- From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key Key, select Settings > Display > Screen timeout.
- Select when you would like your screen to turn off, then press the Center

Soft Key to confirm.

d) To adjust Key backlight timeout

- From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key ok, select Settings > Display > Key backlight timeout.
- Select when you would like your screen to turn off, then press the Center
 Soft Key ok to confirm.

e) Change font size

- Go down to the bottom, press **Navigation Key (Left, Right)** select small, default, large or largest. Press back to save.

f) Change Display size

- From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key ○κ, select ⑤
 Settings > Display > Display size
- Go down to the bottom, press Navigation Key (Left, Right) select small or default. Press back to save.

10.5 Battery

From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key ok, select Settings > Battery

At the top of the page, battery capacity percentage remaining will be seen.

- Battery usage: To see an overview of your battery level and activity for the last 24 hours.
- Use battery manager: Press Center Soft Key or to toggle detection when apps are draining battery.
- Battery percentage: Press Center Soft Key ok to show battery percentage in the status bar.

10.6 Storage

From the Home Screen, press the **Center Soft Key** ok, select **Storage**.

- This Device: Press the Center Soft Key to access and select SD card or This device.
- Free up space: Press the Center Soft Key ok to access and free up space.

10.7 Accessibility

From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key ok, select Settings > Accessibility

- **Vibration:** press the **Center Soft Key** ok turn on/off Ring vibration and Notification vibration
- TTY Mode: Press the Center Soft Key ok to select TTY off, TTY full, TTY HCO, TTY VCO.
- RTT mode: Press the Center Soft Key ok to turn on/off RTT calls.
- Audio adjustment: Press the Center Soft Key to turn on/off Mono audio. Press Navigation Key (Left, Right) to modify audio balance.

10.8 Privacy & Security

a) Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by creating a password.

b) Device admin apps

Activating this admin app will allow the app file manager to perform the following operations:

- Change the screen lock
- Set password rules
- Lock the screen

c) SIM Security

A SIM PIN prevents access to the SIM card cellular data networks. When it's enabled, any device containing the SIM card will request the PIN upon restart. A SIM PIN is not the same as the lock code used to unlock the

device.

10.9 Software Update

To access Software Updates, follow the steps below:

- Connect your device to a Wi-Fi network and make sure it has a strong data connection.
- Ensure your battery is fully charged before starting the software update.
 Your device's current battery level can be found on your device under
 Settings > Software Update > Check for updates
- When there is a new mandatory software update version available, the phone will start downloading automatically. Select Continue to update your system.

10.10 System

a) Language & input

Your device can be operated using English and Spanish language.

- Press the Navigation Key to select the desired language preference.
- Press the Center Soft Key ok to confirm.

b) Date & Time

From the Home Screen, press the Center Soft Key , select Settings > System > Date & Time

a) Set time automatically:

- Use network-provided time: Time will be set according to your SIM network information.
- Use GPS-provided time: Time will be set according to your location information.
- Off: Turn off time setting automatically. Only on "Off", you can set date and time manually.
- b) Automatic time zone: Press Center Soft Key ok to toggle on/off.
- c) **Select time zone:** Press **Center Soft Key** to select the zone according to the location.

Note: Only when Automatic time zone is "Off", you can select the time zone manually.

d) Use Locate default & Use 24-hour format: Press **Center Soft Key** ok to toggle on/off the default or individual selection.

11 Safety and Precautions

11.1 Device Precautions

This mobile phone is well designed with detail. Please exercise special care when using it. The following suggestions will help your mobile phone survive the warranty period and extend its expected service life:

- a) Keep the mobile phone and all its accessories beyond children's reach.
- b) Keep the mobile phone dry. Keep away from rain, moisture, liquid, or other substances that may corrode electronic circuits.
- c) Do not use or store the mobile phone in a dusty place to avoid damaging the device.
- d) Do not store the mobile phone in a high temperature place. High temperature will shorten the life of electronic circuits and damage the battery and some plastic parts.
- e) Do not store the mobile phone in a cold place. Moisture may collect inside the mobile phone and damage electronic circuits when the mobile phone is moved to a warmer environment.

This Model Phone Meets the Government's Requirements for Exposure to Radio Waves. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations, the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy. This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.39 inches (1.0 cm) between the user's body and the back of the phone.
